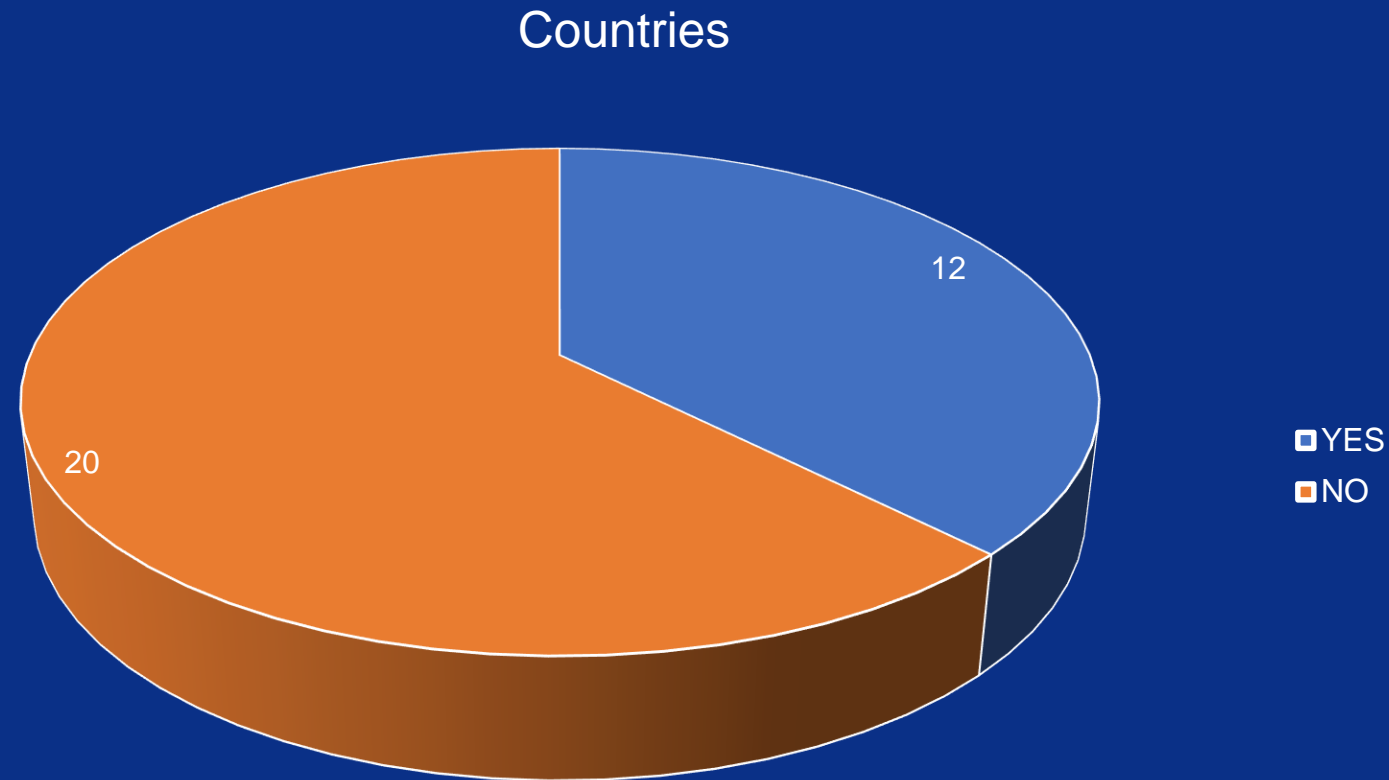

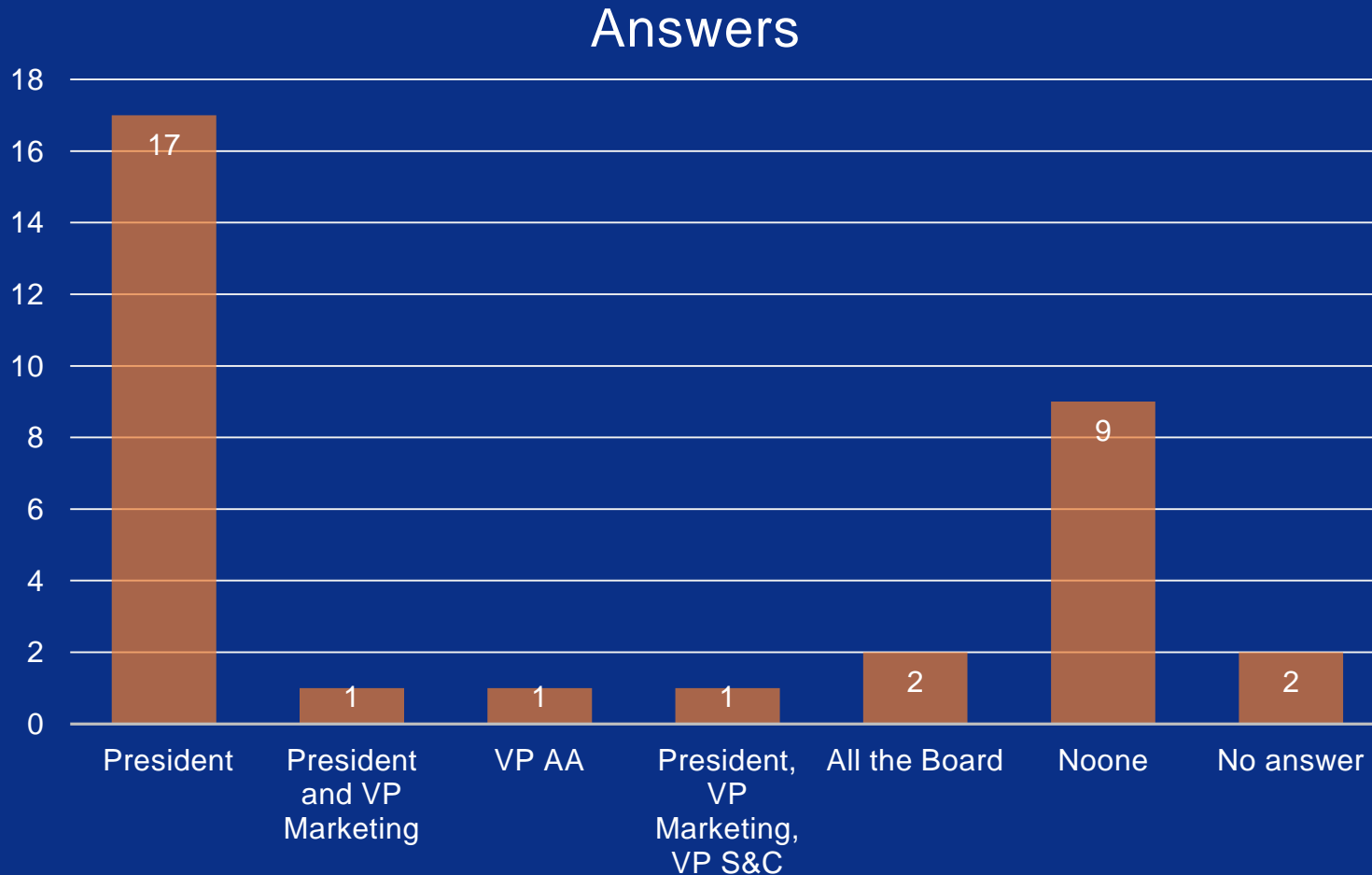
Does your National Group advocate?

Who is the person in charge of advocacy within your National Group?

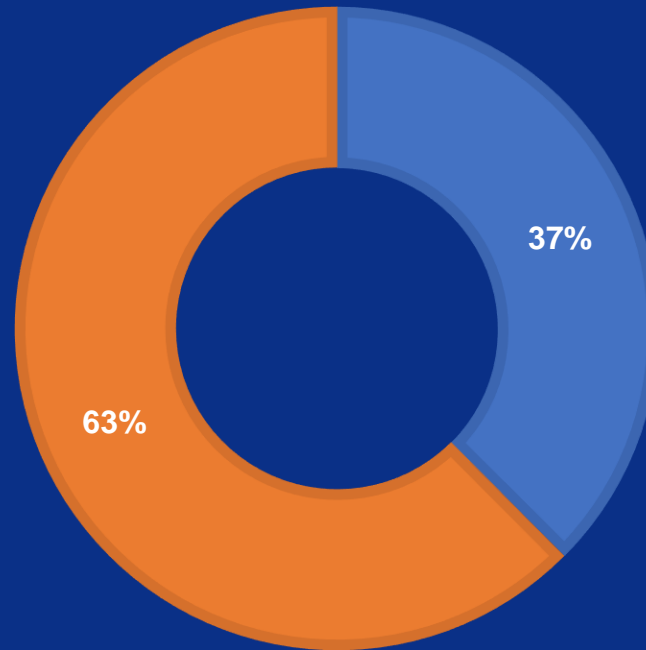

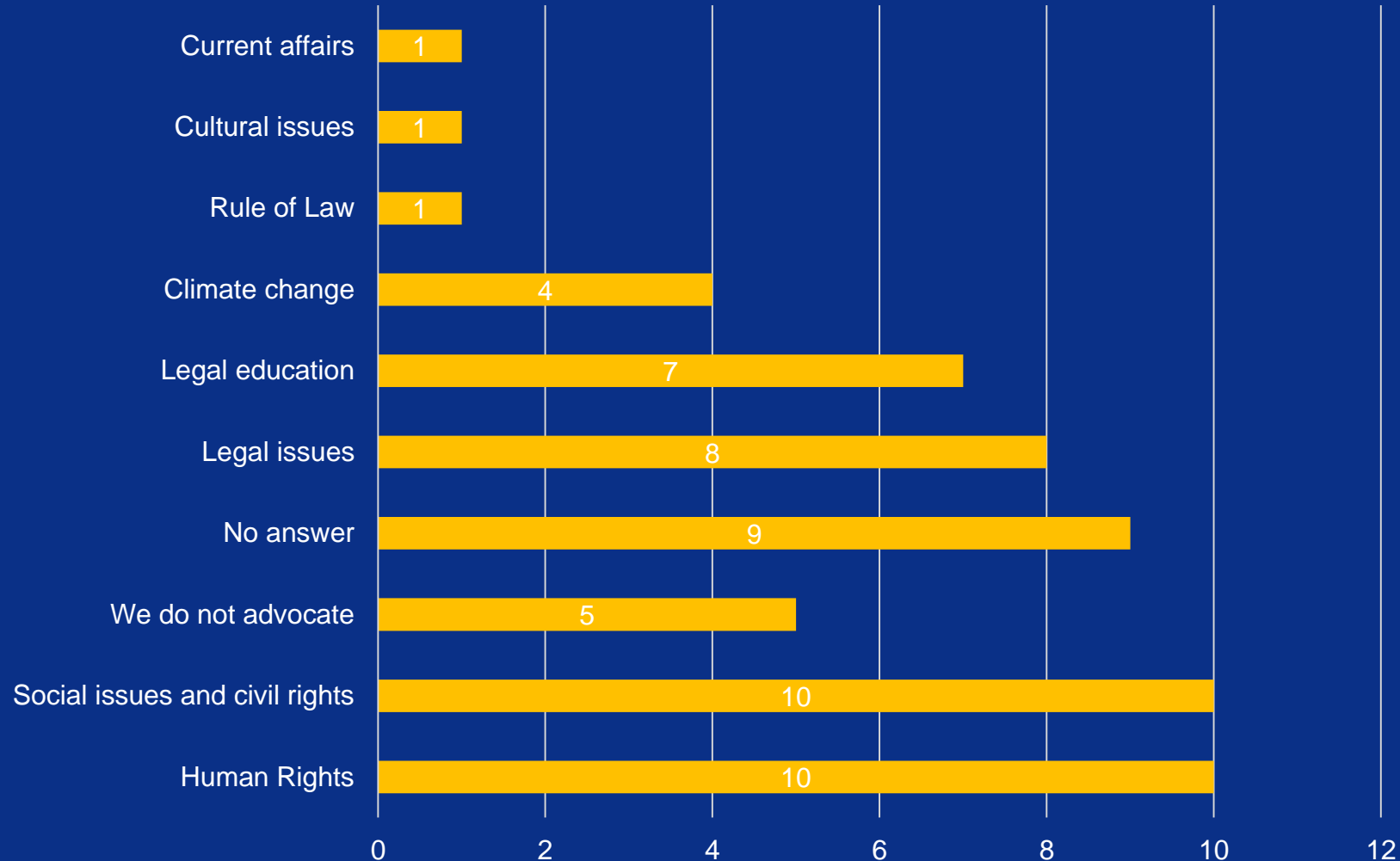

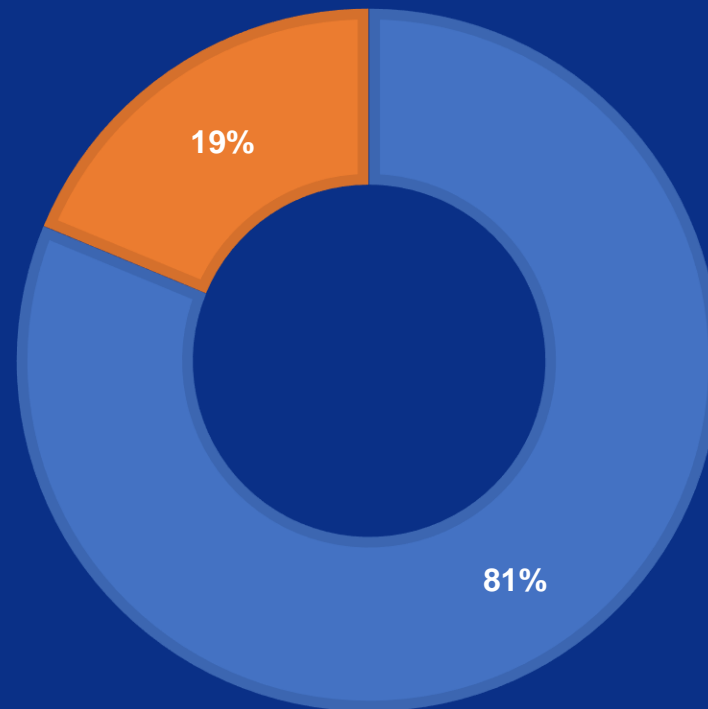

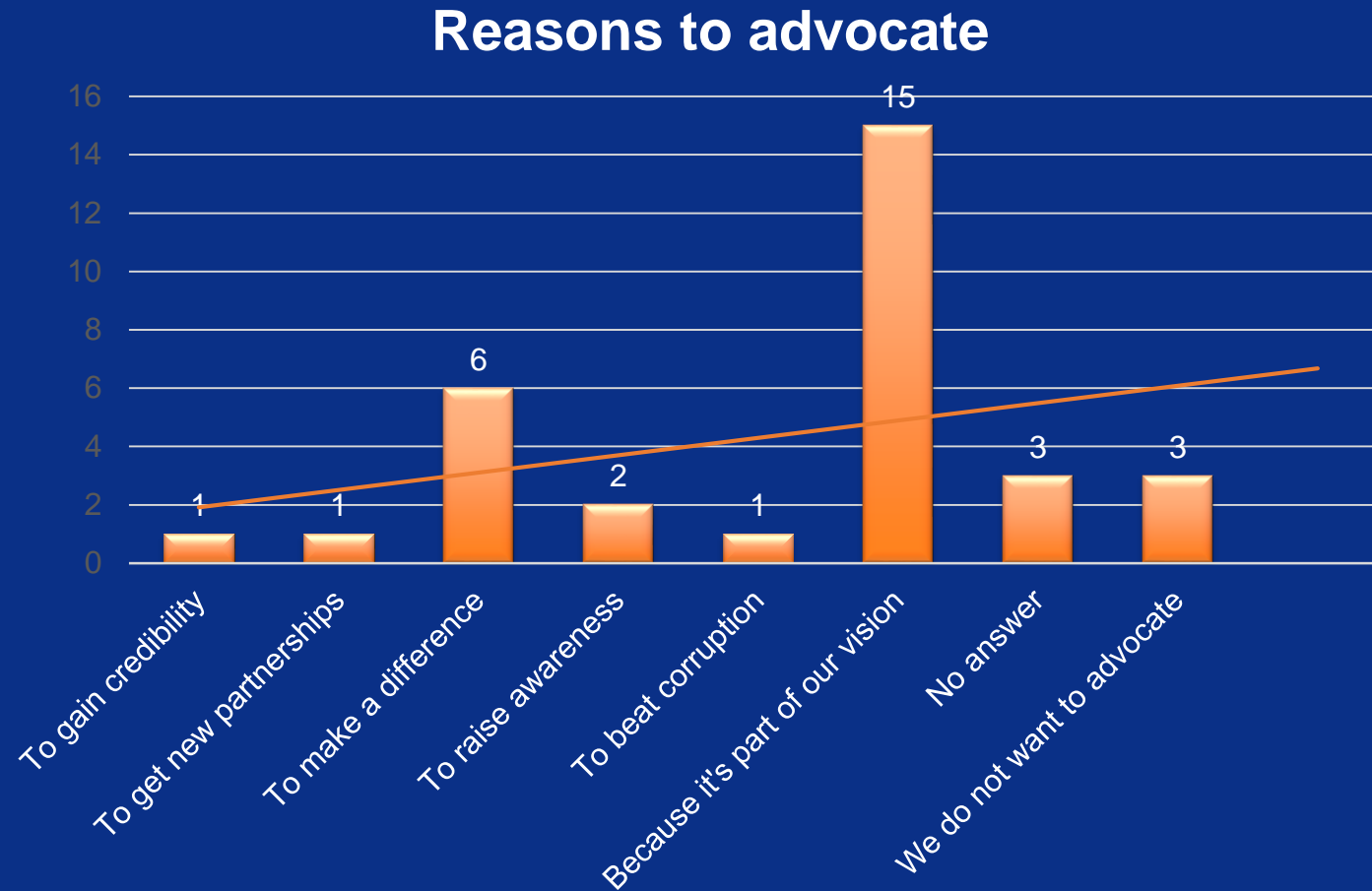

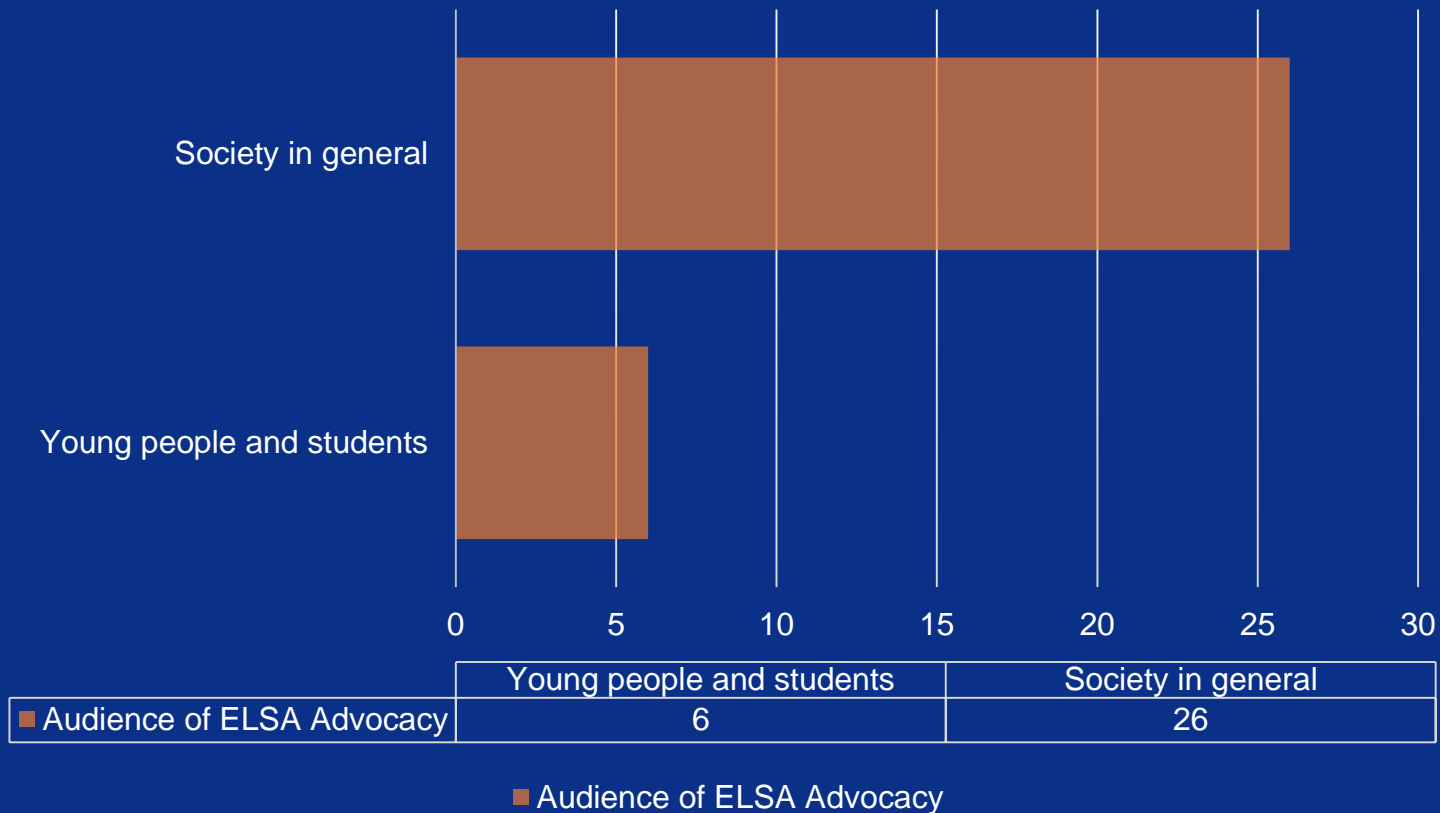

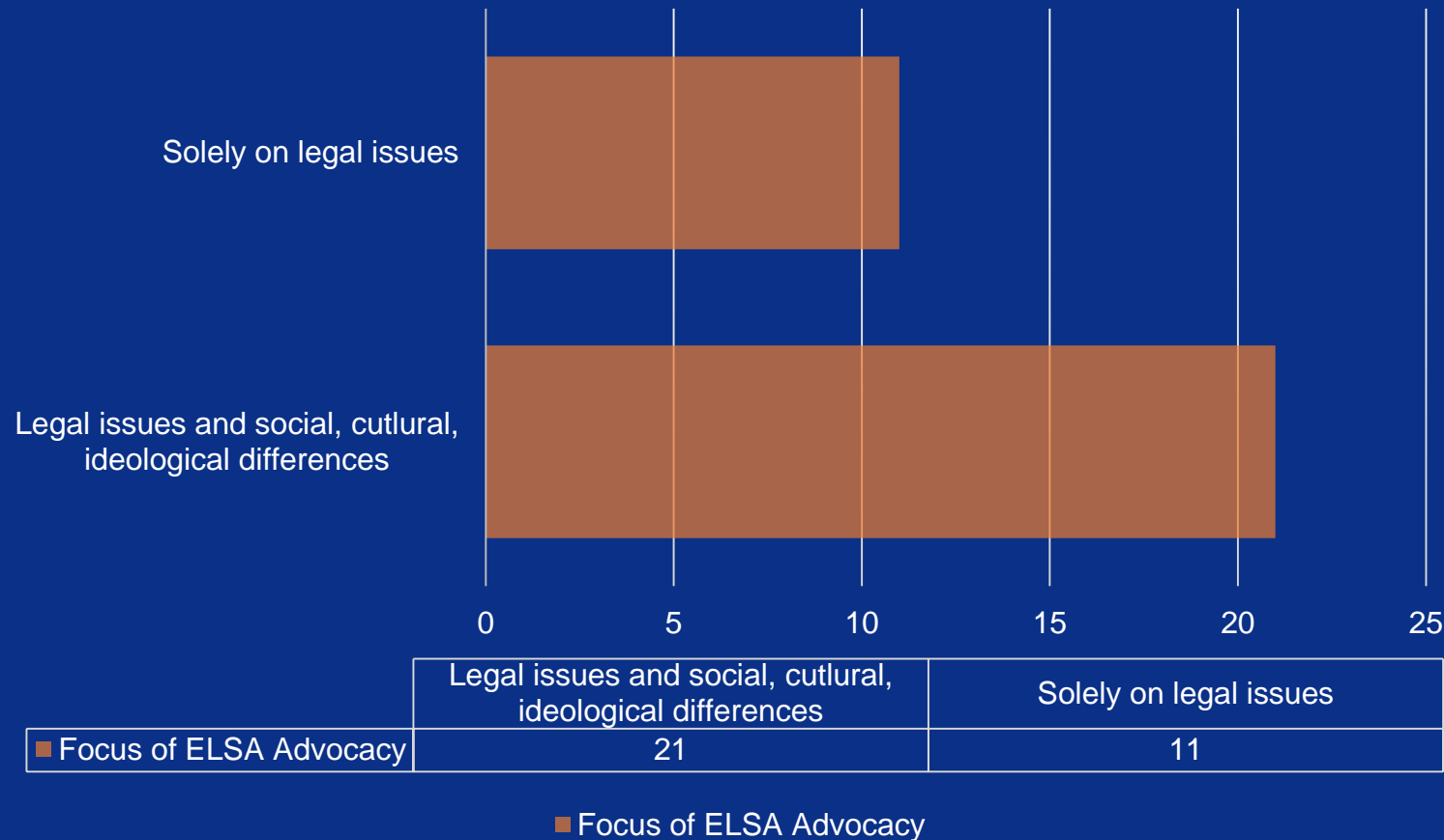

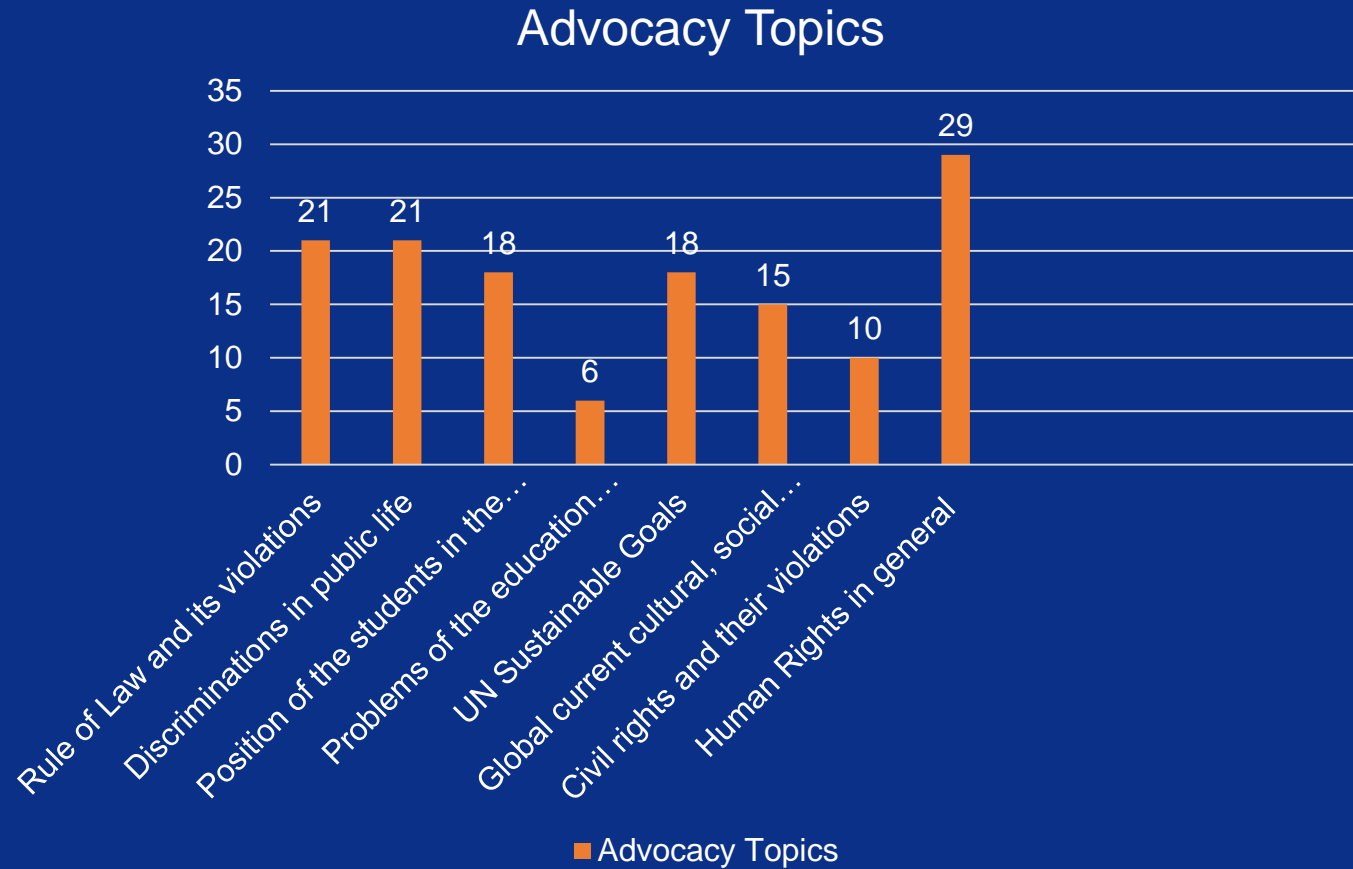

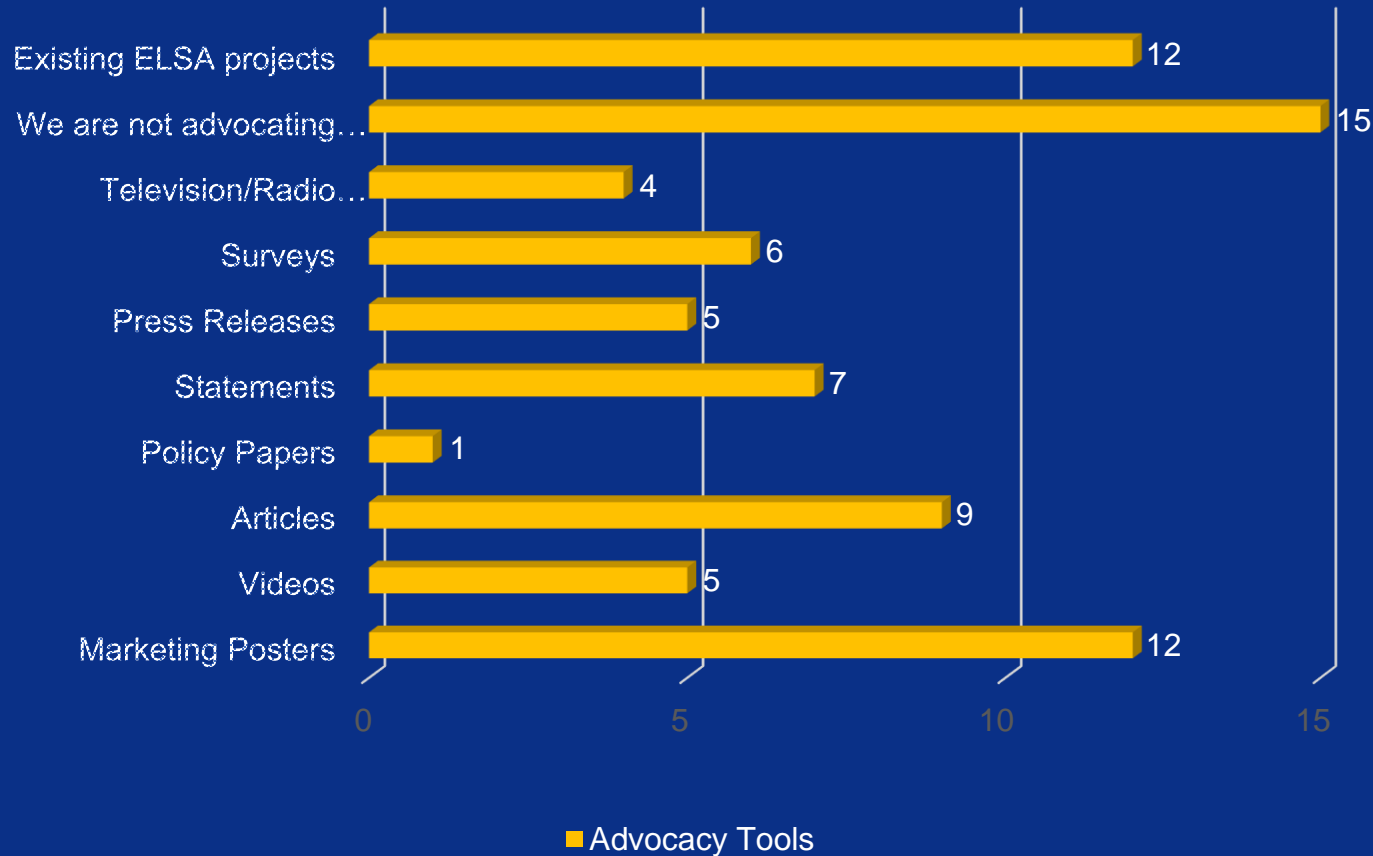

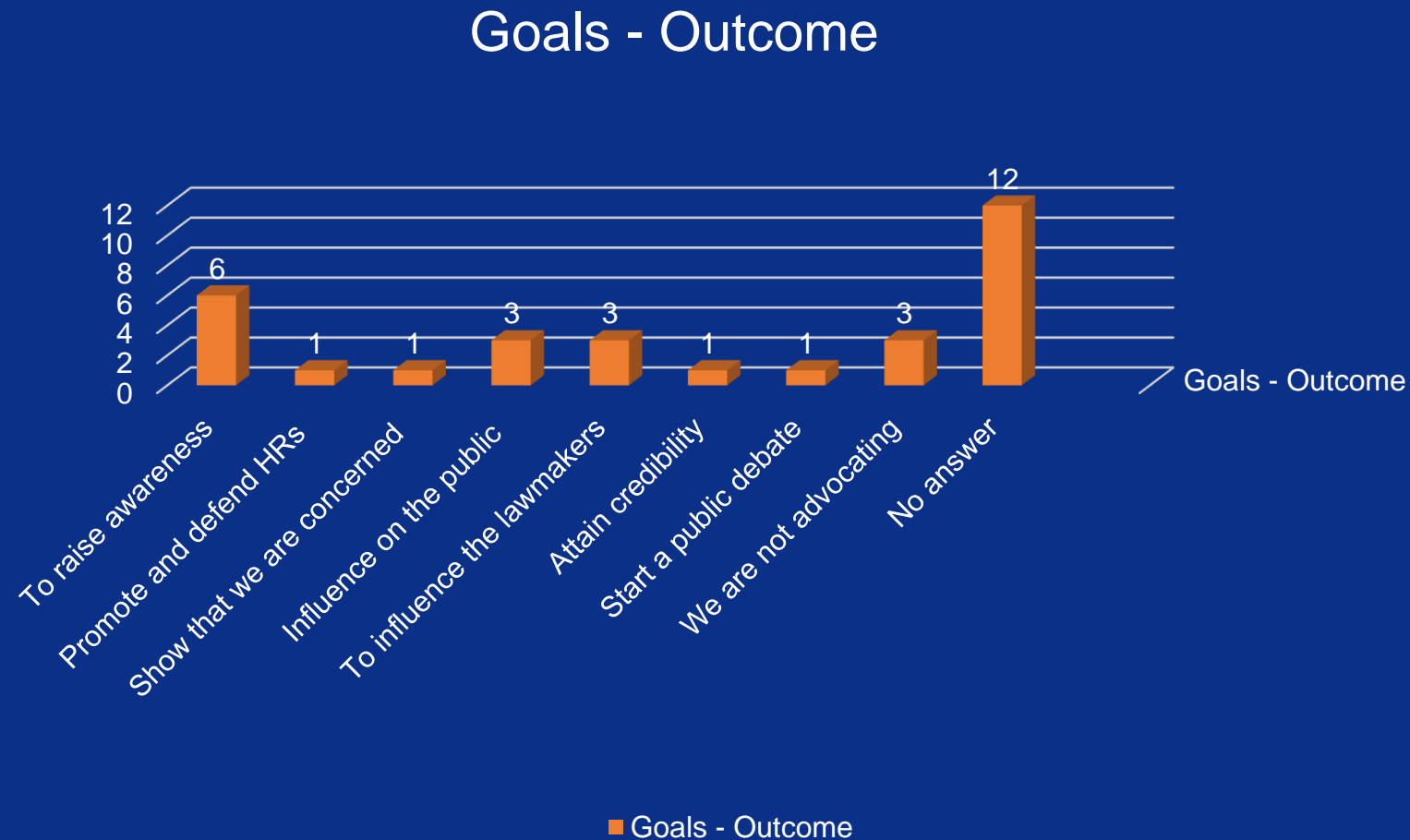

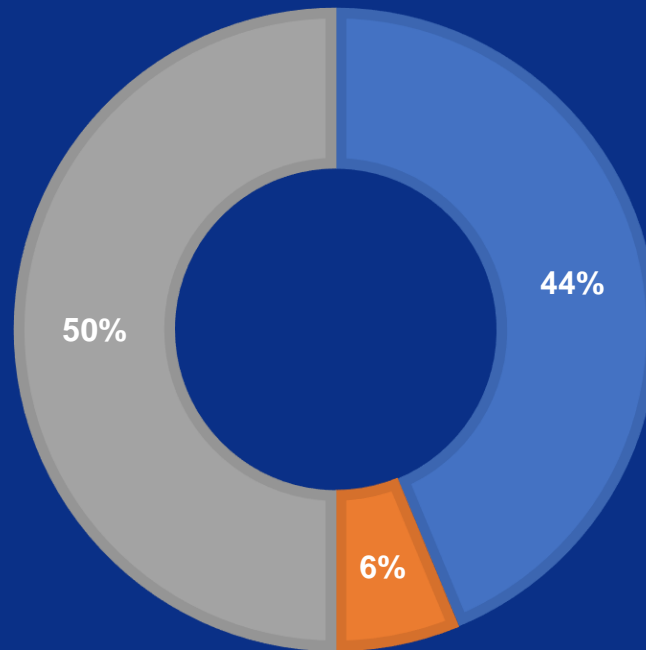

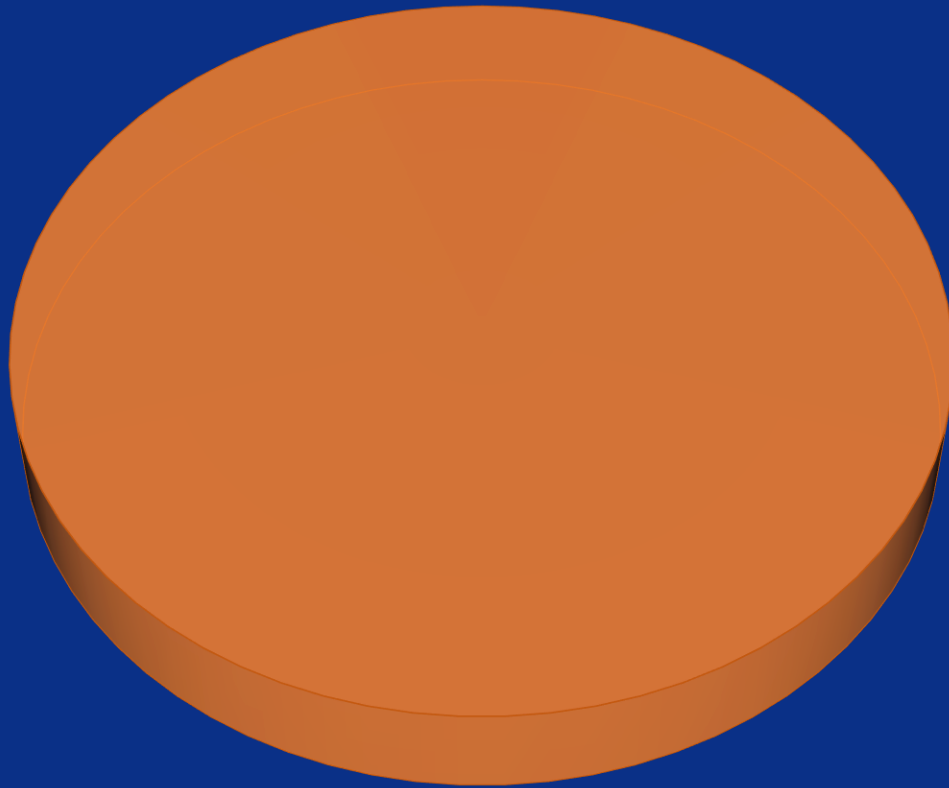

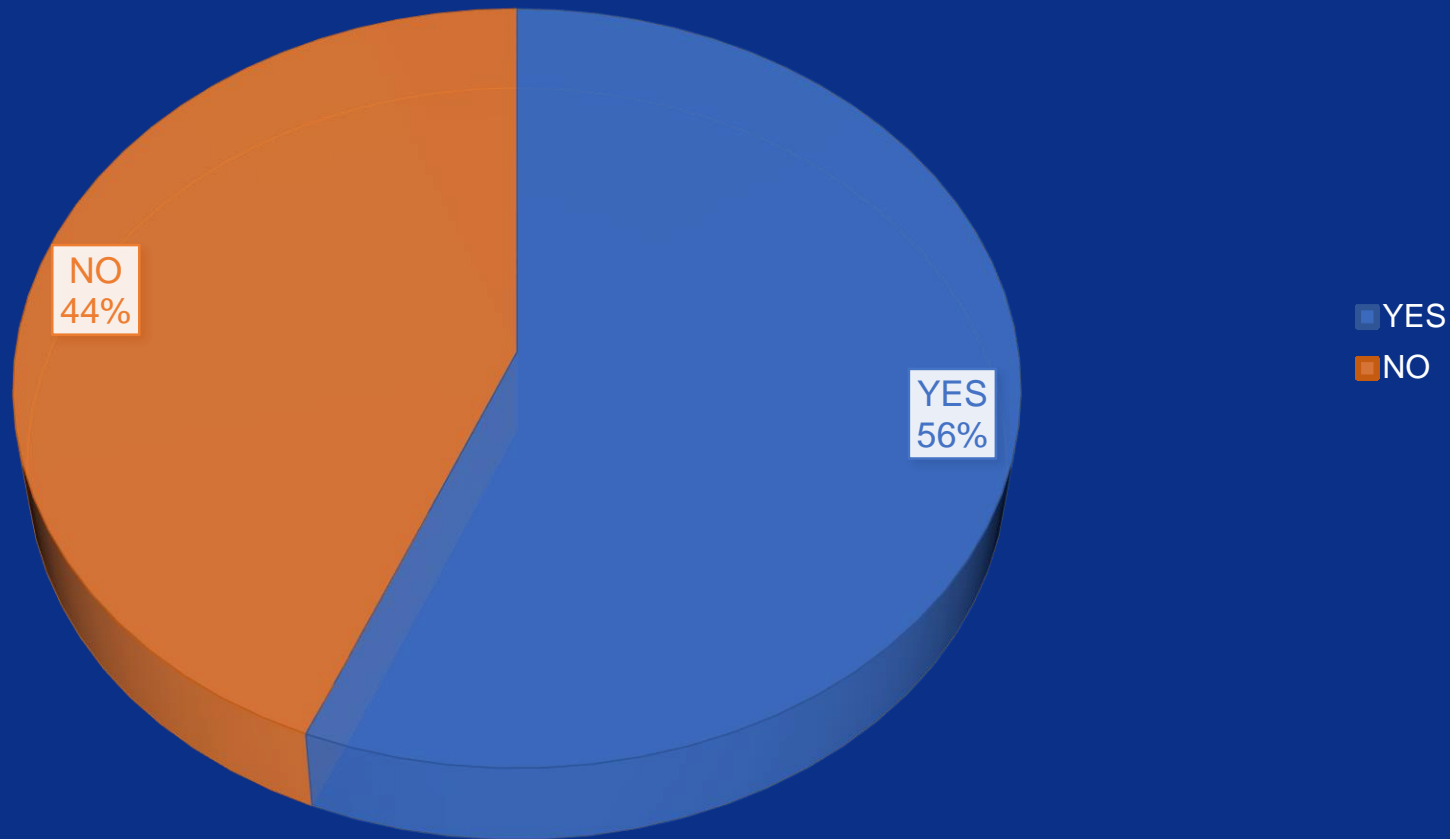

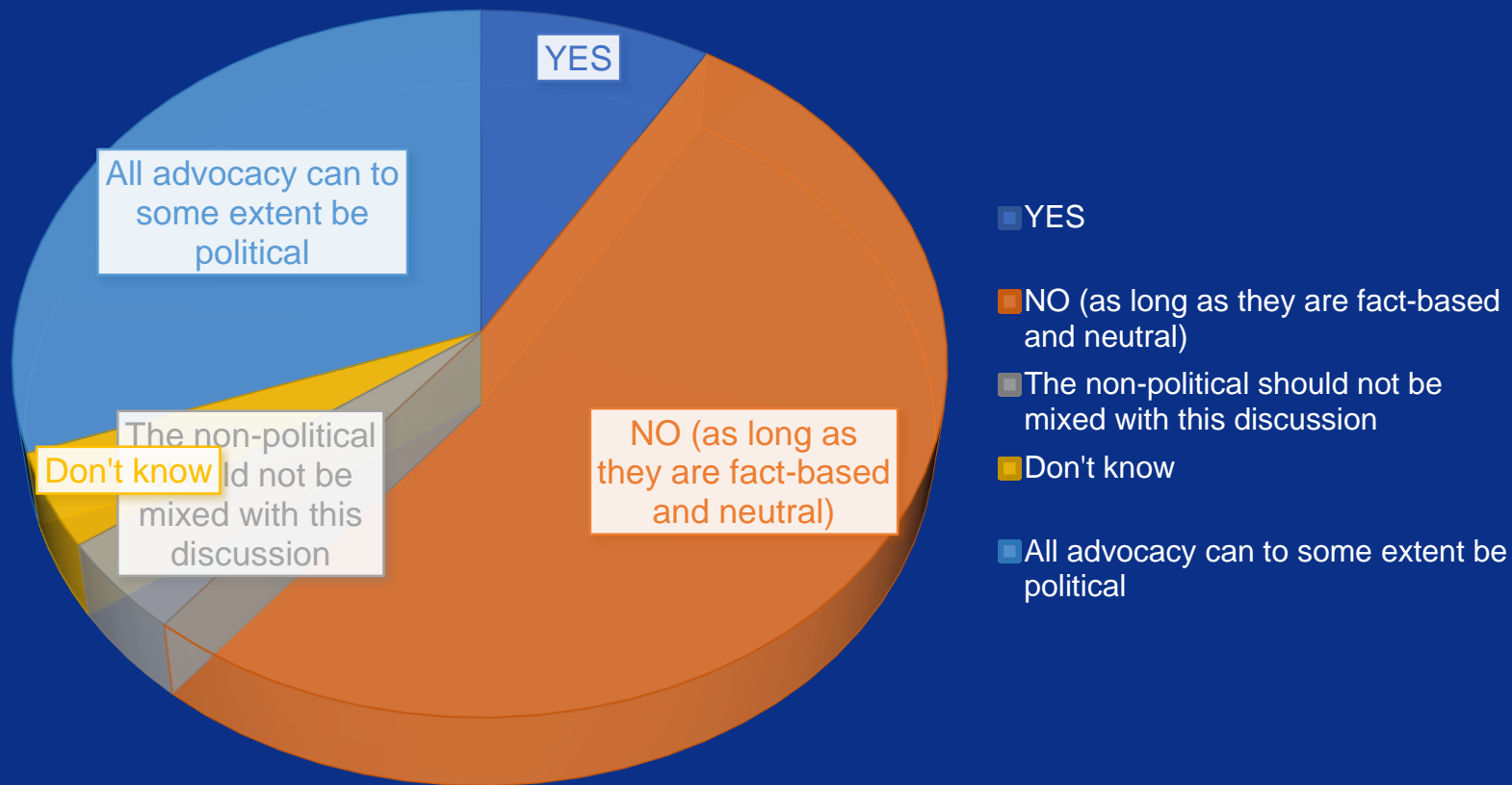

Should the guidelines be binding or not?



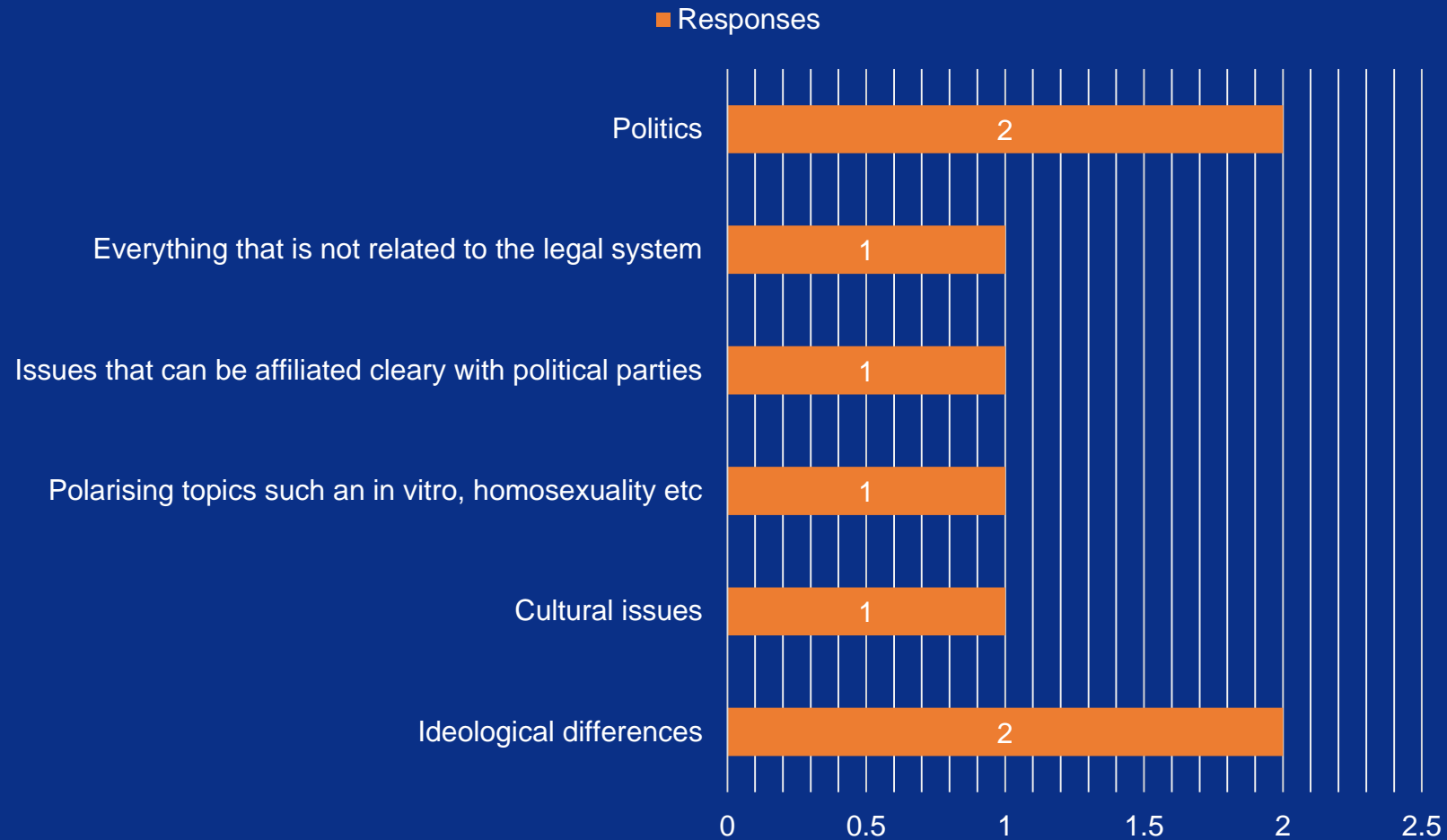
Do you think speaking out on some topics might affect the non-political status of ELSA?

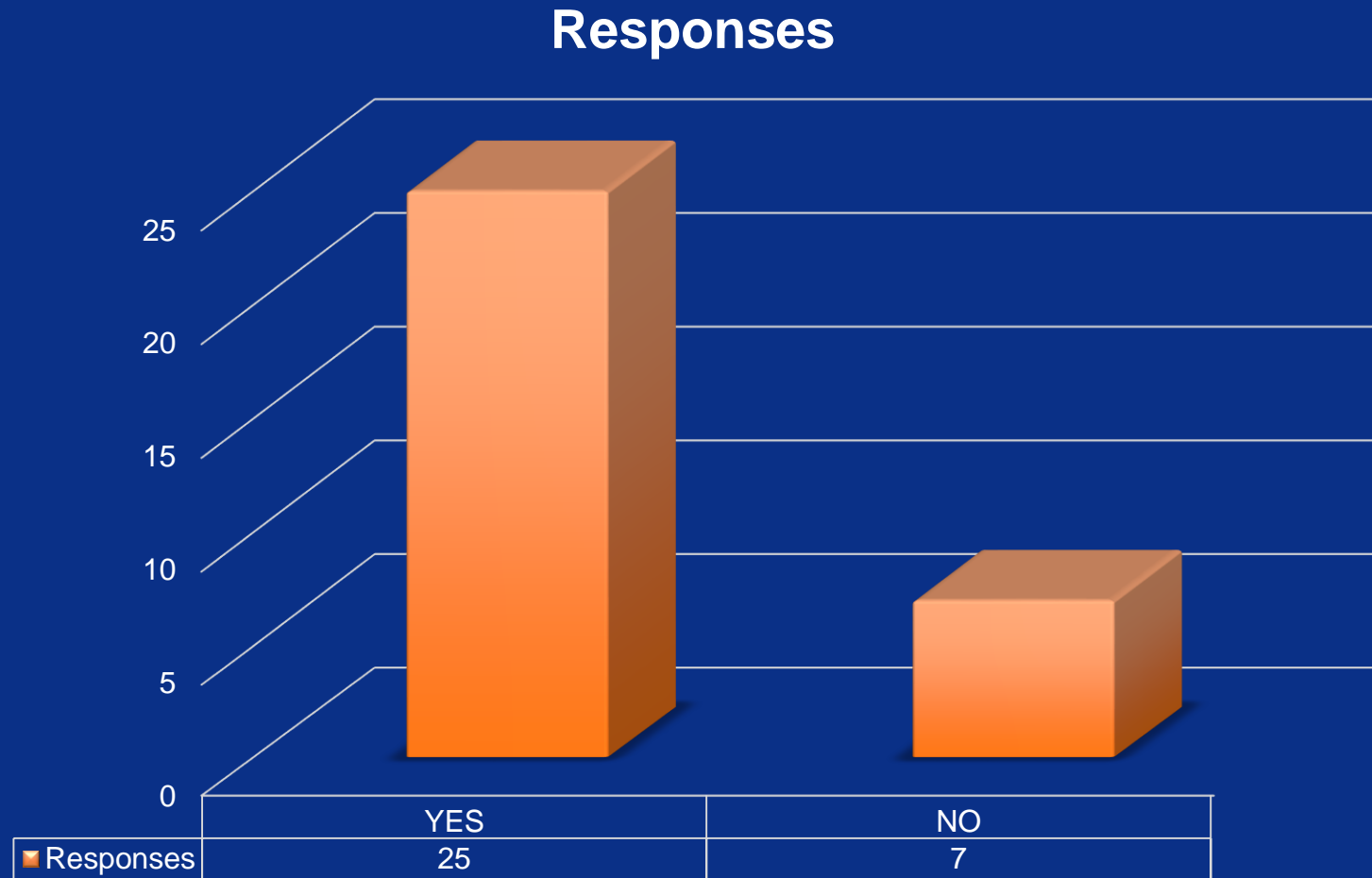


Which topics are those?

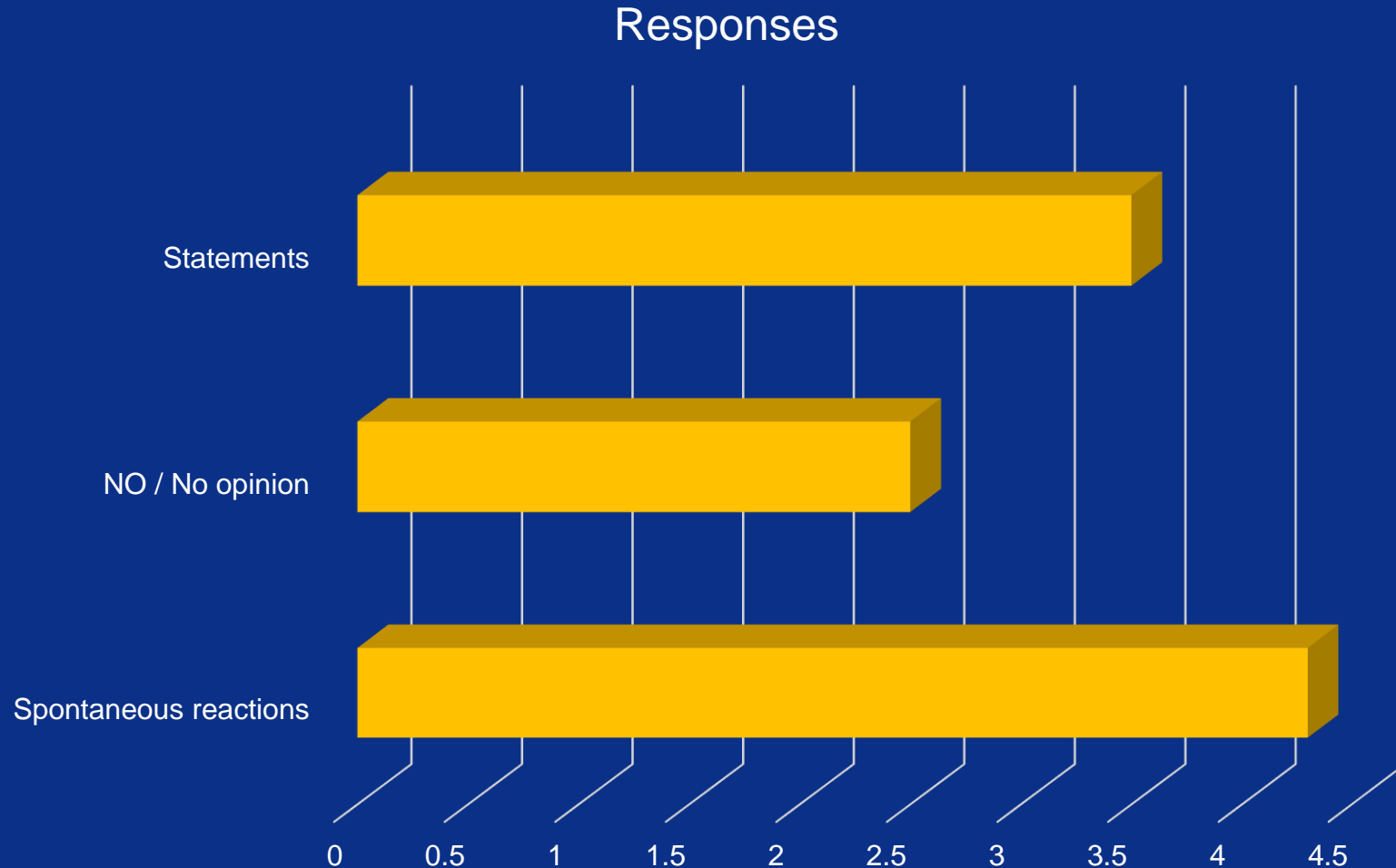

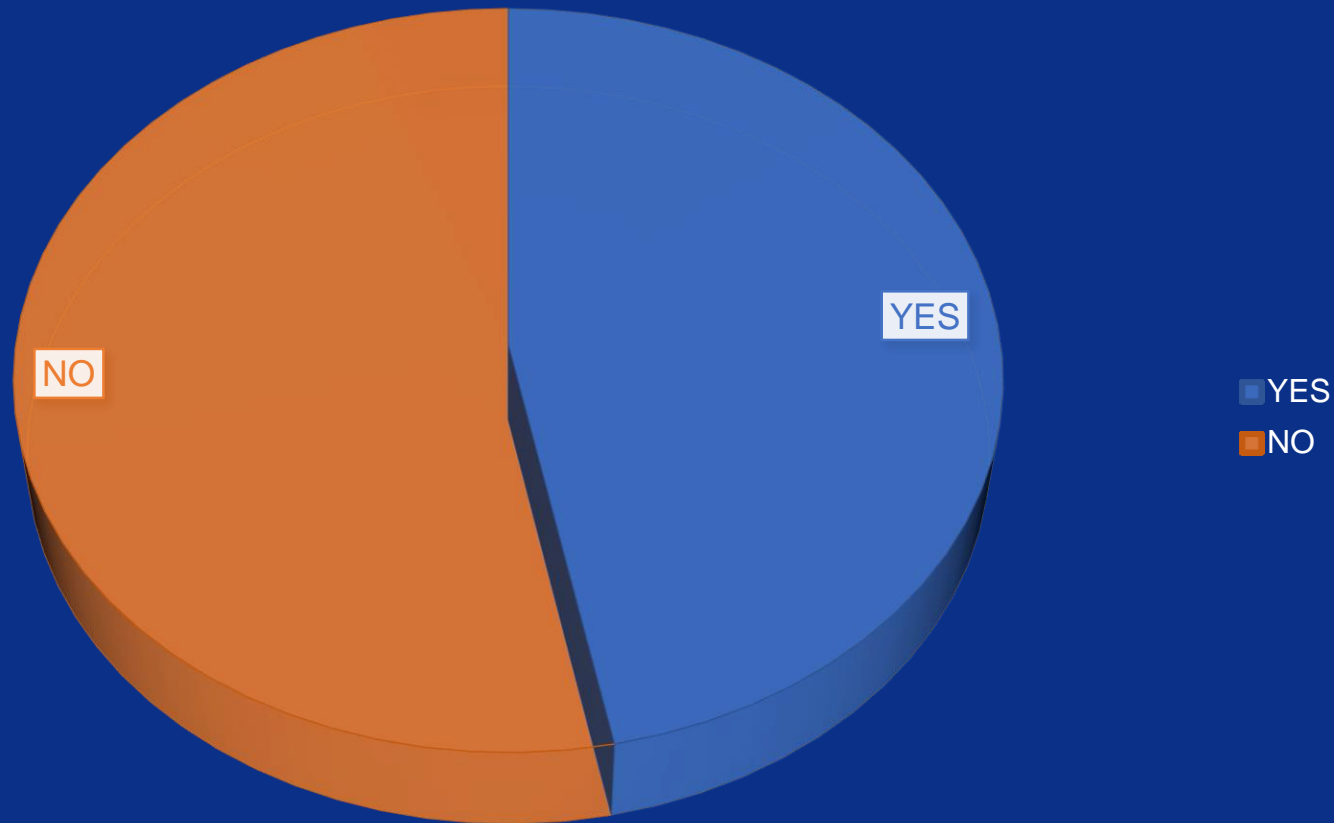

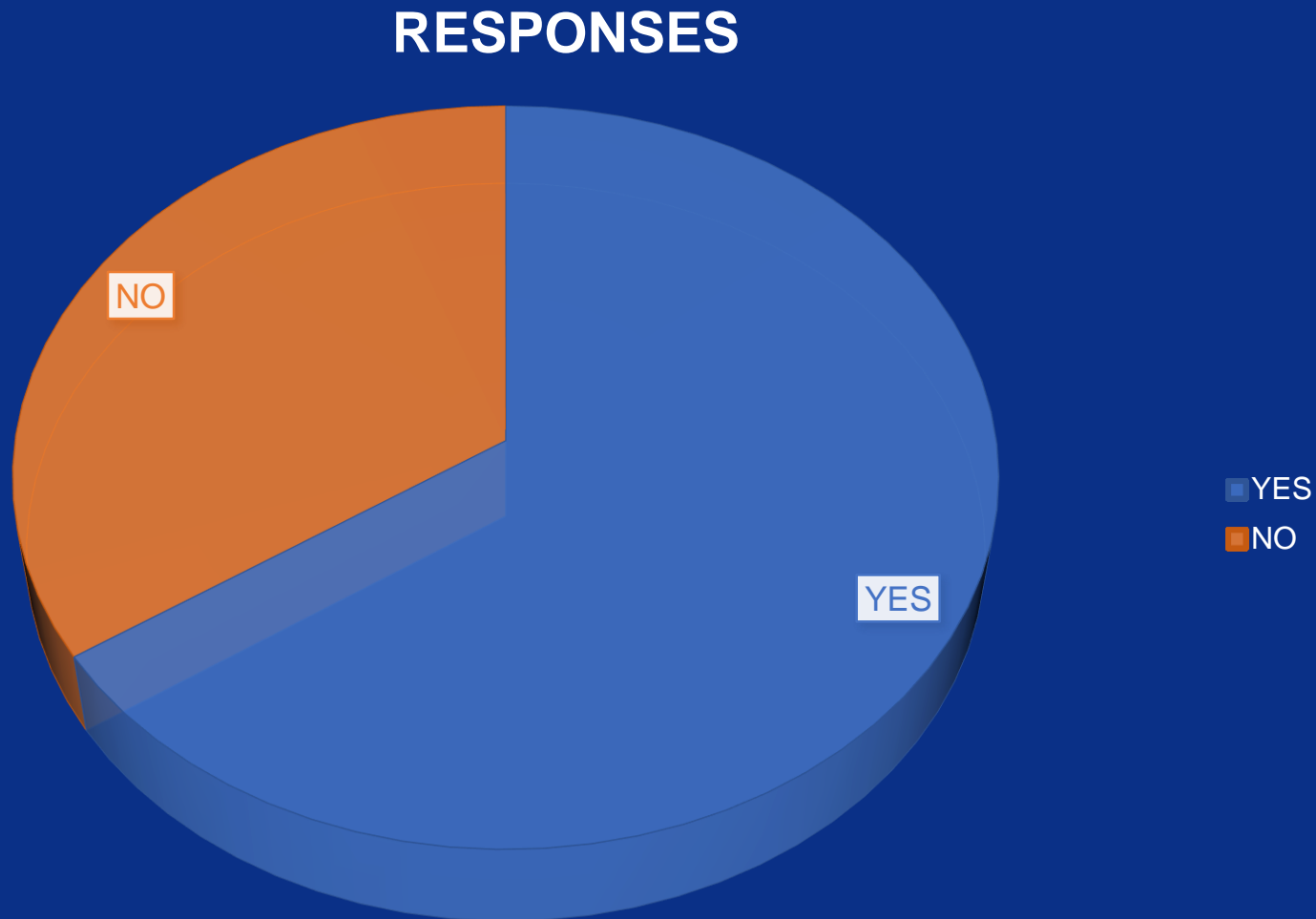

Do you feel the need to respond and advocate quickly on topics that have a network (or global) impact?

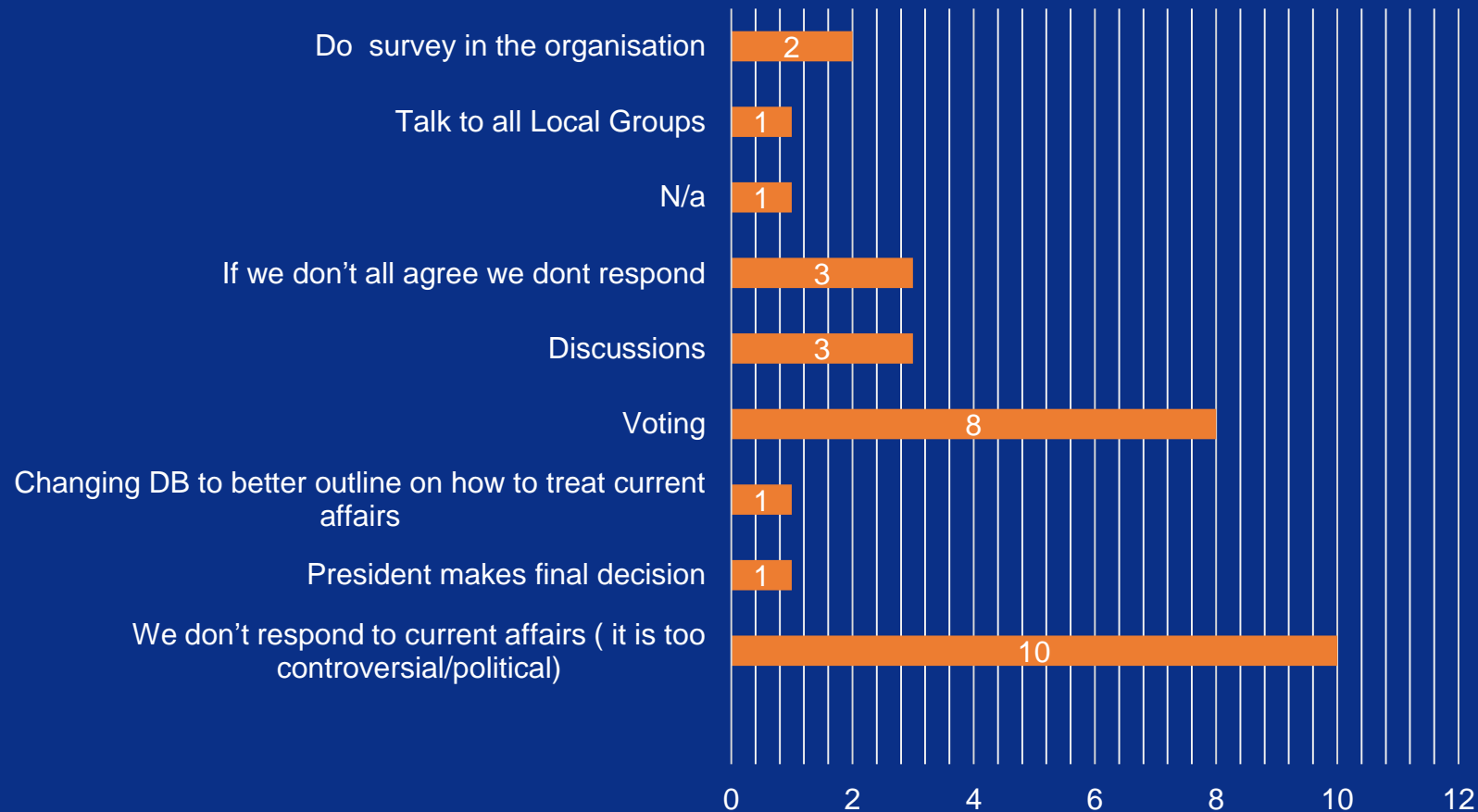

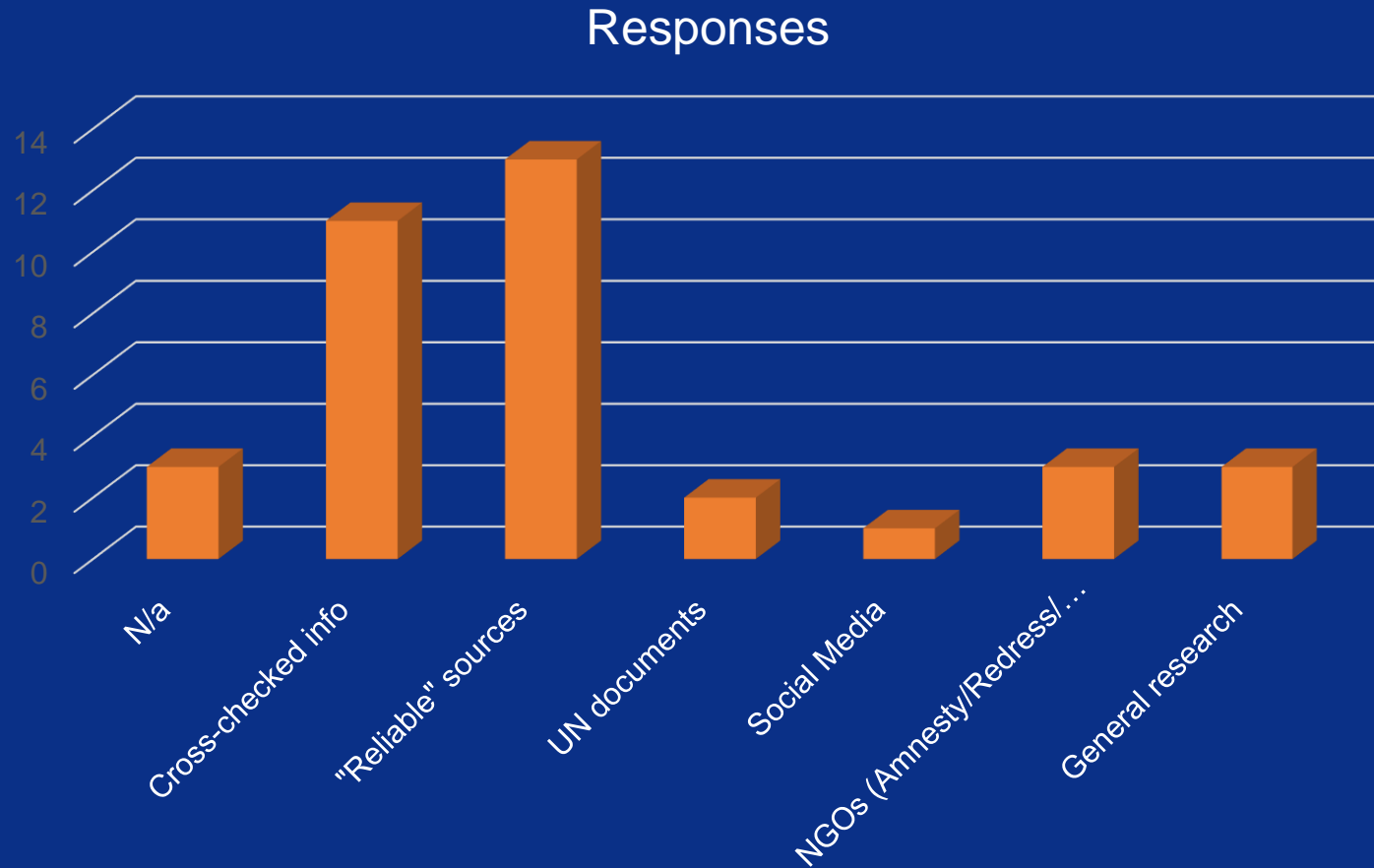
