# 3 principles for fundraising

Always remember what you're fundraising for.

Plan well and structure ahead of time.

# What do you need before starting?

Organizational budget and Non-profit tax status;

 A donor tracking database and a system to quickly acknowledge donations and donors;

 Individuals (staff, board, volunteers) who are trained in how to ask for money;

Knowledge of available funding sources;

## What to do before starting?

 Basic materials about the organization and knowledge of who you are and what you can sell (Flagship Projects, Upcoming Projects...)

Clarity and agreement about how the funds will be used;

A fundraising plan.



## How to ask for what you want?

1. What is the need?

- 2. How do you address the need?
- 3. How can they be a part of addressing the need?



## The magic phrase:

• "Would you consider...?"

• "What would you consider..?"



#### To never do:

• "I am not here to ask for money.."

• "Would you consider supporting us wit 5K? ...Hmm maybe 3K" Never change your proposal within seconds. Don't take it back.

"Whatever you could do to help!"



## To always remember:

• "Don't ask...don't get."

• Never assume.
