Privacy Policy of the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition

General statement

The European Law Students' Association (hereinafter ELSA) fully respects your right to privacy, and will not collect, process or publish any personal data about you other than as set out in this privacy policy. Any personal information, which you provide to ELSA will be treated with the highest standards of security and confidentiality, strictly in accordance with applicable data protection laws.

What is the purpose of the data collection?

ELSA International needs to collect the data from the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition registration form in order to be able to successfully administrate the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition. ELSA International fully and exclusively administrates the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition, which means collects all the applications, i.e. the data from the above-mentioned application form.

The necessary data from the application form will also be forwarded to the applicant's National ELSA Group in the respective country if requested and to a Regional Round Organiser of the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition where deemed necessary by ELSA International. This is necessary for successful organisation of the Regional Rounds.

Certain data may be used for the creation of statistical data, which will always be generalised numbers only, completely anonymised.

What personal data does ELSA collect in application forms?

ELSA International collects only the data that are needed to fulfil the purpose of it being collected, which is the data that are relevant for ELSA International to ensure eligibility to register to the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition. The necessary data collected are visible in the above-mentioned application form.

Who has access to your information and to whom is it disclosed?

John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition

ELSA International's John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition Team has access to all data submitted necessary to organise the Competition. ELSA International discloses the names of the applicants to the National ELSA Groups upon justified requests, i.e. to send the participants necessary information about the national or international events regarding the Competition organised by National ELSA Groups. Some of the National ELSA Groups, and therefore some of the National Coordinators, are located outside of the European Union, in a country deemed not to offer a similar level of data protection as within the European Union.

Contact details may be provided to the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition sponsors and WTO. Registered team members can expect to receive communications from the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition Sponsors, regarding their career opportunities. ELSA International undertakes to handle all information provided to it under the applicable rules of the European Union (i.e., GDPR). Teams may consult the privacy policy set forth on the registration form in terms of who their data may be shared with and for what purpose.

How long do we keep your data?

The data will be kept for as long as it is necessary for the administration of the John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition, i.e. as long as there is a need to disclose this data to John H. Jackson Moot Court Competition Team for them to fulfil the purposes stated above. However, that period is never longer than one year from when the data are submitted.

How can you access your personal data, verify its accuracy and, if necessary, correct it?

In accordance with applicable data protection laws, you have a right to access your personal data, and request correction of inaccurate, or deletion of irrelevant personal data. When you submit your application, an e-mail confirmation is sent to your e-mail address.
