Structure of a good Motivation Letter

- Know to whom you **address** the letter! In our case, this is ELSA International.
- In the **first paragraph** of the letter:
 - briefly introduce yourself,
 - show interest in the project and the specific ELSA Delegation you are applying to,
 - demonstrate that you know well the committee/institution where you're applying to.
- Use the **second paragraph** to:
 - explain your interest to the specific ELSA Delegation and in the topic of the respective Delegation,
 - point out your specific academic background relevant to the topic of the session.
- In the **third paragraph**:
 - explain how you would like to benefit from the participation, academically and professionally,
 - show your awareness on the importance of holding the role of an ELSA Delegate.
- In the **final paragraph**:
 - focus on your strongest qualities and be creative in your delivery: add your personal touch while stating your motivation,
 - always end with a positive note by reaffirming your motivation, enthusiasm, and suitability to the position of ELSA Delegate.
